Rational

Compliance with the applicable EU / International requirements.

Avoidance of major non-conformity during an NAA scheduled audit or NAA oversight activities that might lead into aircraft grounding or business closure.

Requirements

The accountable manager is intended to mean the manager who has the authority to ensure that all activities subject to Part-ORO, Part-NCC or Part-SPO can be financed and carried out in accordance with the applicable requirements. Being the accountable manager, should depend upon the nature and scale of the commercial specialized operation. The two main areas of concern should be competence and an individual's capacity to meet his/her responsibilities. Nominated persons in accordance with EASA ORO.AOC.135 or any other specific national requirement around the

Nominated persons in accordance with EASA ORO.AOC.135 or any other specific national requirement around the world should normally be expected to possess the experience and meet the provisions that are listed below. There may be exceptional cases where not all of the provisions can be met. In that circumstance, the nominee should have comparable experience and also the ability to perform effectively the functions associated with the post and with the scale of the specialized operation.

- practical experience and expertise in the application of aviation safety standards and safe operating practices;
- comprehensive knowledge of:
- (i) the applicable safety regulations and any associated requirements and procedures;
- (ii) the operator's high-risk specialized operation authorization, if applicable; and
- (iii) the need for, and content of, the relevant parts of the specialized operator's operations manual;
- familiarity with management systems mostly in the area of aviation;
- appropriate management experience, preferably in a comparable organization; and
- 7 years of relevant work experience of which at least 5 years should be from the aeronautical industry in an appropriate position.
