



AIRCRAFT SECURITY



The aim of this course is to ensure full compliance with the international regulations (ICAO, EASA, etc) as well with the National Authorities.

The main objective is to ensure that cockpit crew and cabin crew can effectively fulfill their responsibilities in the field of civil aviation security.

By the end of the course, the participant's will be able to apply the security procedures imposed by the legislation in the field and to use them in the operational activity.

Syllabus

MODULE 1 – CIVIL AVIATION SECURITY AWARENESS TRAINING

- Previous acts of illicit intervention in the field of civil aviation, terrorist acts and current threats;
- · Applicable legal requirements;
- Objectives and organization in the field of civil aviation security;
- · Obligations and responsibilities of persons applying security measures;
- Security checkpoint configuration;
- The security control process;
- Access control procedures and security control procedures;
- Airport ID cards;
- · Reporting procedures;
- How to react appropriately in the event of security incidents.

MODULE 2-AIRCRAFT SECURITY

- Aircraft access control measures;
- Aircraft security search;
- · Civil aviation security measures applicable in flight;
- Knowledge of aircraft security search;
- Procedures for the treatment applicable to unruly passengers;





- Procedures regarding the transport of potentially disruptive passengers;
- · Potential acts of sabotage;
- · Crisis procedures;
- · On-board supplies;
- Acceptance of airline mail (COMAIL) and materials (COMAT);
- · Aircraft cleaning products and supplies.

MODULE 3-AIRCRAFT SECURITY EXAMINATION

- · How to perform aircraft security checks to a standard sufficient to ensure, in a
- · reasonable manner, the detection of concealed prohibited articles;
- · Legal requirements regarding the aircraft security checks;
- The configuration of the type of aircraft that the person must undergo the security examination;
- · How prohibited articles can be disguised;
- How to identify prohibited articles;
- Behavior to follow when detecting prohibited items.

MODULE 4-AIRCRAFT PROTECTION

- How to protect the aircraft and prevent unauthorized access;
- Aircraft sealing procedure;
- Emergency response procedure;
- The procedure for challenging persons, as well as the circumstances in which persons must be challenged or reported.

MODULE 5 – HOW TO TREAT POTENTIALLY DISRUPTIVE PASSENGERS

- Objectives and organization in the field of aviation security, including the
- · obligations and responsibilities of persons applying security measures;
- Procedures for the treatment applicable to unruly passengers;
- Procedures for the transport of potentially disruptive passengers.

MODULE 6 - BOMB THREATS

- Procedures applicable in case of a bomb threat, received by telephone;
- Procedures applicable in the event of a bomb threat, received directly from a person;
- Procedures applicable in the event of a bomb threat, received by mail;
- Threat assessment.
